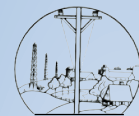

What is the PCA fee on my monthly bill and why is it necessary?

The power cost adjustment (PCA) is the most accurate reflection of what it costs to generate electricity and deliver it to your co-op substations. Without the PCA, your co-op would have to 'guesstimate' future generating costs and build that guess into its basic rate. Members would be forced to pay extremely high bills that may or may not be accurate based on the cost of fuels at that time.

When I pay the PCA fee, where is my money going?

The power cost adjustment is paid directly to your co-op's wholesale power suppliers, KAMO Power, and Western Farmers Electric Cooperative (WFEC). Your co-op currently purchases 92 percent of its power from KAMO and eight percent from WFEC.

Why does it fluctuate so much?

Generating costs fluctuate daily based on the price of natural gas, coal and other fuels used to generate electricity.

Daily fluctuations in fuel costs make it impossible to predict the exact amount of the PCA.

Why can't the co-op buy electricity from a less expensive supplier?

KAMO is the least expensive power supplier in the region. In fact, KAMO rates are lower than the national average.

Will power costs continue to go up?

Wholesale power costs actually decreased last year by a small percentage due to the lower price of natural gas. If federal regulations on power plant emissions are enforced, the cost to generate electricity in the future will definitely increase. Programs such as ECE's Community Solar Project aim to control the overall rising wholesale energy prices by providing an alternative source of power. ECE energy audits, rebates, and energy saving tips in your newsletter and on Facebook will also help you balance rising costs.

Right-of-Way Work Underway

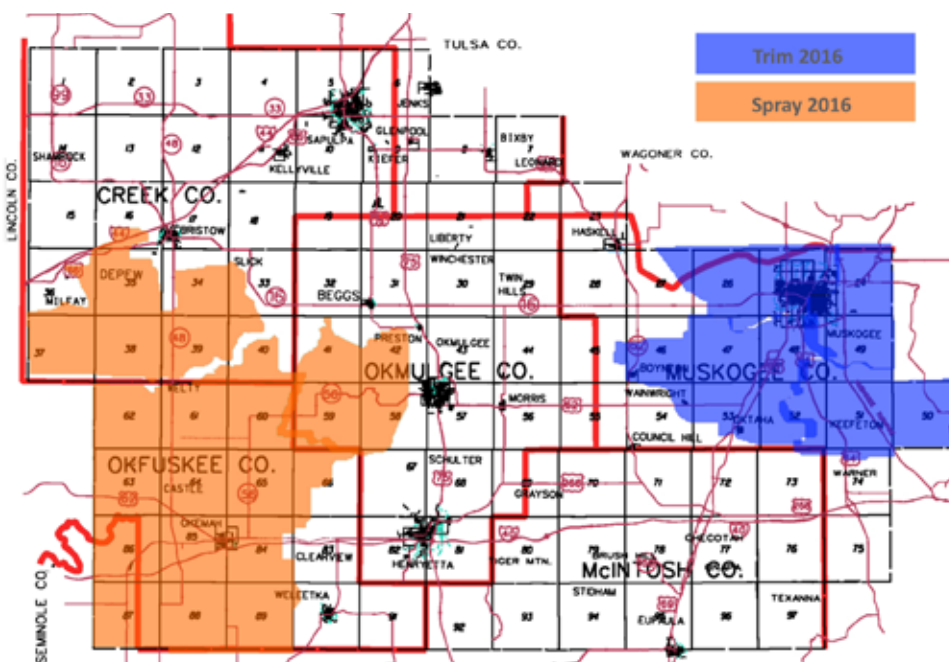
Please watch for right-of-way contractors working in your area

Recipes

Great tastes for members of East Central Electric Cooperative

Lemon Pie Bars

INGREDIENTS

2¼ cups all-purpose flour
½ cup confectioners' sugar
1 cup butter, softened
4 eggs
1½ cups white sugar
½ cup lemon juice
1 tablespoon lemon zest



DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350° F. Mix 2 cups of flour and confectioner's sugar together. Cut in the butter or margarine. Mix well until the dough resembles pie dough consistency. Press the dough into a 9x13 inch baking pan.

Bake 15 to 20 minutes or until golden brown.

Beat together eggs, sugar, 4 tablespoons flour, lemon juice and lemon rind for at least 1 minute. Pour the mixture over the baked crust.

Bake the bars another 20 minutes, or until the lemon topping has set. Sprinkle with confectioner's sugar when cooled. Yield: 32 bars.
